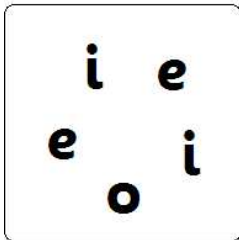
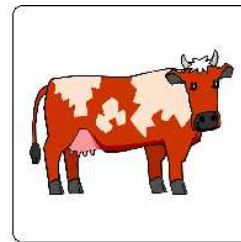
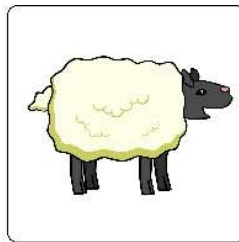
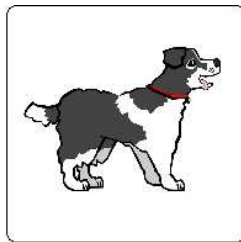
Overlay 1 – What am I? (comprehension)

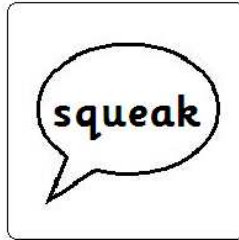
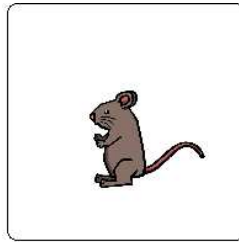
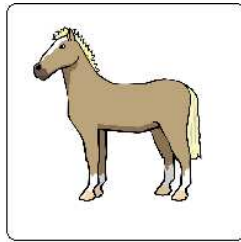
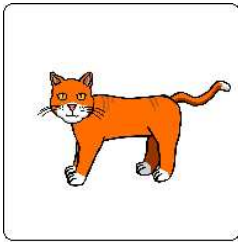
Overlay 2 – Old MacDonald (singing)

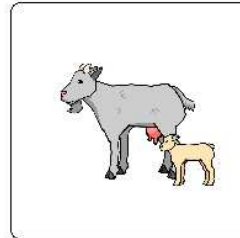
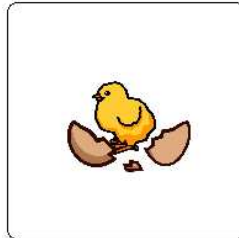
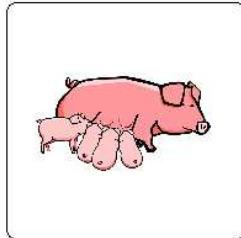
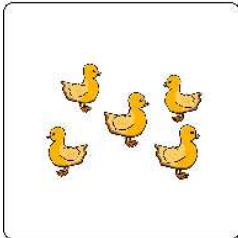
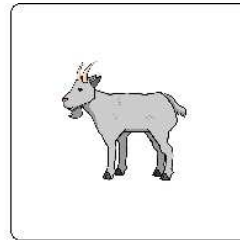
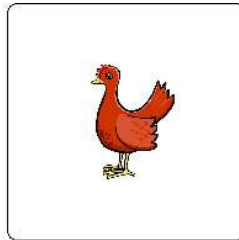
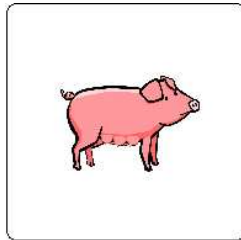
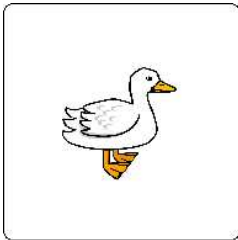
Overlay 3 – Animal noises (symbolic expression)

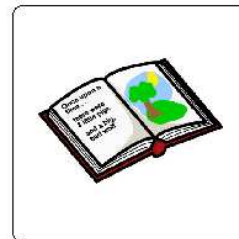
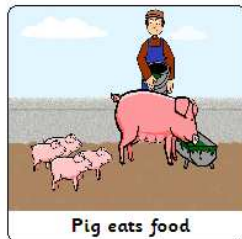
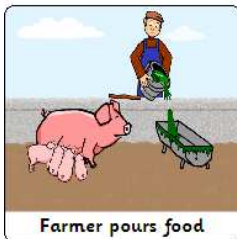
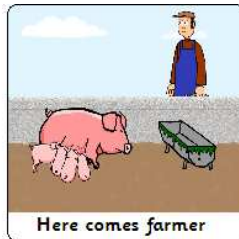
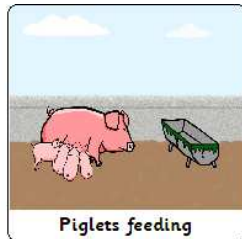
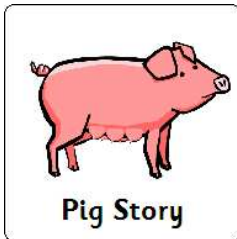
Overlay 4 – Belonging to (semantic relationships)
